Baptismal Information

God bless you for presenting your child for baptism in the Catholic Church. To have your child baptized at St Mary Magdalen Catholic Church, you need to do the following:



- Read the Baptismal Information Guidelines, especially the requirements for your Godparents.
- 2. Discuss your baptismal plans with your family and those whom you would like to have as Godparents to determine if they meet the guidelines to be a godparent.
- 3. Complete the Baptismal Questionnaire, return it to the parish office.

DATE AND TIME OF BAPTISMS


Baptisms should be scheduled at least two months in advance.

Generally, Baptisms are celebrated the <u>first and second Sunday of the month at 1:00 PM</u> Parents along with the child to be baptized and godparents are invited to attend the 12:00 PM Mass.

PARISH GUIDELINES

CHILDREN ELIGIBLE FOR BAPTISM

Children who have, at least, one parent who is a formally registered and practicing member of St. Mary Magdalen





GODPARENTS AND CHRISTIAN WITNESSES

Godparents are more than just special friends or relatives of the child to be baptized. Godparents stand as representative of the Catholic community and act as a special witness to the child of what it means to be a good Catholic.

To be a godparent, a person must be:

- 1. A baptized Catholic who has received the sacraments of Confirmation and holy Communion and is practicing the Catholic faith.
- 2. Mature enough to undertake the responsibility.
- 3. A member of the Catholic Church canonically free to carry out this responsibility. (Catholics currently living in a marriage not considered valid by the Catholic Church or cohabitating are excluded from being a godparent.)
- 4. Someone other than the father or mother, spouse or fiancé of the one who is to be baptized.

A validly baptized and believing Christian from a separated church may act as a Christian Witness so long as there is also a Catholic Godparent. A non-baptized person may never act as a Godparent or Christian witness.

If a godparent is unable to attend the baptismal ceremony, it is possible to have a "proxy". A proxy is a stand-in at the ceremony when the designated godparent can not be present. The designated godparent will be noted in the official record of the parish or they can be present via Zoom or other social media platform.

Godparents must provide a letter from the Church that they attend stating they are eligible to act as a godparent.

COMMON QUESTIONS

Fee

The fee for the Church is \$125.

God and the church have not been very important in our lives, but we still want to have our child baptized. Is that OK?

Yes. But you must understand that baptism is not a magical event. It will fall to you as parents to continue the process of initiating your child into the faith. Baptism is often an event that brings families back into contact with their religious roots.

What if my child is not an infant?

Depending on the age of the child, it will be necessary to give some instruction about baptism so that the child will understand the nature of the sacrament.

If I am an unmarried mother, can I have my baby baptized?

Yes! The Church makes no judgment on you or your child. You are both welcome in the eyes of God. We simply want to be assured of your commitment to your child's raised as a Catholic. But, we also encourage the parents to be married in the Catholic Church.

If my husband and I were only married in a civil ceremony, can I have our baby baptized?

Yes, as long as you are committed to have your child raised as Catholic. Perhaps, this is a time to consider a Catholic marriage. The priest can give you advice on how to overcome obstacles that have delayed your Catholic marriage.

If I am divorced or separated from my spouse, can I have my baby baptized?

Yes! It is necessary, however, to ensure that each parent's rights are respected. When one parent has legal custody, that parent determines the religious affiliation of the child. Where the court has granted joint custody, there must be mutual written agreement that both parents wish to have the child baptized and that the child will be raised Catholic. If the court has not determined legal custody, it is necessary to provide a written agreement that both parents wish to have the child baptized and that the child will be raised as a Catholic.

If one of the parents is not Catholic, can I have my baby baptized?

Yes! As long as the non-Catholic parent agrees to have the child baptized and raised as a Catholic. We will make every effort to ensure that the non-Catholic parent will feel welcome at the baptism. If for some personal reason, the non-Catholic parent does not want to participate in the baptismal ceremony, we will respect that parent's wishes.

Prayer of Parents at Baptism

Loving God, you given me this child. On this baptism day, help me to encourage my child's faith. Help me to foster faith, growth and responsibility in my child. Help me to teach, to love, to value, to honor our child. But most of all, Lord, help me always to remember that our child comes from your love. Amen.
